Rock Island County Targeted Problem of Early Childhood Success – Detailed Version	
Child Impact: Not all young children are developing positively.	
Child Impact Outcomes (ITP)	<p>Not all children are meeting benchmarks for social and emotional development. Proxy: The percent of Kindergarteners demonstrating readiness in social and emotional development is lower than the state in 5 of 9 school districts in 2022 in Rock Island County. The data range in 2022 varies from 36% in Silvis SD to 93% in Carbon-Cliff Barstow compared to 55% in the state. 55% of schools in Rock Island County are not meeting benchmarks for social and emotional development.</p>
Child Early Success Outcomes (HB, ITP)	<p>More babies are born to teen mothers. Proxy: The number of births per 1,000 female population ages 15-19 was 28 in 2022 in Rock Island County. The data is 10 births higher than the state level of 18 in 2022. The data decreases from 35 in 2019 to 28 in 2022.</p> <p>Not all infants and toddlers are enrolled in high quality early learning programs/high quality preschool. Proxy: The number of licensed family child care homes that have an ExceleRate rating of Gold in a geographic area, total licensed capacity 6wks-2yrs is zero in Rock Island County in 2022. Rock Island County has 4898 infants and toddlers in 2022.</p>
Family Early Success Outcomes	<p>More families live below the poverty line. Proxy: The percentage of people under age 18 in poverty in Rock Island County is 3% higher compared to the state's percentage of 16% in 2022. The data range varies from 19% in 2022 to 22% in 2020.</p> <p>More families are experiencing food insecurity. Proxy: The percentage of children enrolled in public schools that are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch in Rock Island County was 59% in 2022. This is 10% higher than the state percentage of 49% in 2022. The data varies from 56% in 2019 to 60% in 2021.</p>
