

ROCK ISLAND COUNTY

Rock Island County is in the northwestern part of Illinois, with a population of 144,808. Rock Island County is home to people identifying themselves as non-Hispanic White (71.7%), Black (10.8%), or Hispanic/Latino (13.0%). According to the U.S. Census, 15.6% of residents live at or below the federal poverty level (FPL), compared with the state rate of 13%. The median household income is \$50,208, compared with the state level of \$59,196.



For this resource, IECAM used the U.S. Census Bureau's QuickFacts, which compiles demographic statistics based on various data programs (e.g., Population Estimates Program, American Community Survey 5-year estimates). The data presented above was retrieved in July 2018 from www.census.gov/quickfacts.

Children under age 5 are 6.4% of the population of Rock Island County. Early care and education in the county are provided by Head Start, Preschool for All (PFA), and child care settings (licensed child care centers, licensed family child care homes, and license-exempt child care centers or homes).

The Illinois Early Intervention Program (funded by IDHS) provides services in the home to children with disabilities, birth to age 3. Preschoolers with special needs (ages 3–5) may be served in PFA sites, Head Start programs, child care settings, early childhood special education classrooms, or the home.
