Tri-County Targeted Problem – Detailed Version	
Child Impact	Not all young children are on a positive developmental trajectory.
Child Impact Outcomes (ITP)	<p>Not all children are meeting benchmarks for social and emotional development.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Proxy: The percentage of kindergartners demonstrating readiness in social and emotional development is lower than the state in 5 of 17 school districts in Peoria County 2022. The data range in 2022 varies from 22.0% in Bartonville SD 66 to 95% in Brimfield CUSD 309. The data compares to 55% in Illinois in 2022. • Proxy: The percent of kindergartners demonstrating readiness in social and emotional development is lower than the state in 6 of 14 school districts in Tazewell County in 2022. The data range in 2021 varies from 33% in Tremont CUSD 702 to 88% in Deer Creek / Mackinaw CUSD 701. The data compares to 55% in Illinois in 2022. • Proxy: The percentage of kindergartners demonstrating readiness in social and emotional development is lower than the state in 3 of 8 school districts in Woodford County in 2022. The data range in 2022 varies from 89% in El Paso-Gridley CUSD 11 to 5% in Germantown Hills SD 69. The data compares to 55% in Illinois in 2022.
Child Early Success Outcomes (ITP)	<p>Not all infants and toddlers are enrolled in high quality early learning programs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Proxy: The number of licensed childcare centers that have an ExceleRate rating of Gold in a geographic area, total licensed capacity for 6wks-2 yrs. is 12 in Peoria County in 2022. Peoria County has 7358 infants and toddlers in 2022. • Proxy: The number of licensed family childcare homes that have an ExceleRate rating of Gold in a geographic area, total licensed capacity 6wks-2yrs is zero in Tazewell County in 2022. Tazewell County has 4294 infants and toddlers in 2022. • Proxy: The total number of children that an Early Head Start center is funded by the Office of Head Start to enroll at any one-time including HS family childcare homes is 0 in Woodford County in 2022. Woodford County has 1114 infants and toddlers in 2022.
Family Early Success Outcomes	<p>More families are experiencing food insecurity.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Proxy: Food environment index, Index of factors that contribute to a healthy food environment, from 0 (worst) to 10 (best) is 7.3 in Peoria County in 2022. The data is 1.4 lower than the State index of 8.7 in 2022. The data range has decreased from 7.5 in 2021 to 7.3 in 2022. • Proxy, Free and reduced lunch, Percentage of children enrolled in public schools that are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch is 54% in Peoria County in 2022. The data is 5% higher than the state data of 49%. The data range varied from 50% in 2020 to 54% in 2022. • Proxy: The food environment index, or index of factors that contribute to a healthy food environment, from 0 (worst) to 10 (best), is 8.1 in 2022. The data is lower than the state index of 8.7 in Tazewell County in 2022. The data is 0.6 lower than the state's index of 8.7 in 2022. The data range varies from 10 in 2019, 9 in 2020, and 8.2 in 2021.

	<p>More parents/caregivers report being depressed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Proxy: The percentage of adults reporting 14 or more days of poor mental health per month (age-adjusted) is 14% in Woodford County in 2022. The data is 1% higher than the state percentage of 13% in 2022. The data range increases from 10% in 2019 to 14% in 2022.
