Initiative Title:		Not all children are on a positive developmental trajectory					
Initiative Description:		<p>Not all children in Kane County are following a positive development trajectory, specifically families experiencing ACES (poverty, domestic abuse, incarceration, mental health illness, divorce, parental substance abuse, parental death) are not getting the help they need which results in many families with children who are not ready for kindergarten.</p> <p>The Kane County AOK Network will implement systems change interventions by promoting and coordinating a trauma informed response to care to build capacity of local stakeholders around supporting children and families that have experienced trauma.</p>
